VMC Question of the Month: You're on a Visual Flight Rules (VFR) cross country flight in your VFR-equipped 1977 Cessna 172, flying by pilotage at about 3,000 AGL, on your way home with a friend. You're returning later than planned, and your friend asks if he can use his cell phone to call his wife to say he'll be late. Since you're flying VFR and not even using any onboard electronic navigation, is it legally permissible to let your friend make the call?

IMC Question of the Month: You're flying a Piper Archer (PA-28-181) on a night IFR flight. Your weather briefing for the flight did not indicate the potential for icing, however, during the flight you begin to notice an accumulation of rime icing on the temperature probe. What actions should you take? Should you declare an emergency?
